



**The Medtech Canada Mission to Arab Health
Dubai, United Arab Emirates
January 27-30, 2020**

Medtech Canada received funding from Global Affairs Canada (via the Global Opportunities for Associations [GOA] Initiative) to provide an opportunity for Canadian Medtech companies to attend Arab Health from January 27th to 30th, 2020 at the Dubai World Trade Centre and the Conrad Dubai Hotel.

Medtech Canada has funding to support **5 (five)** Canadian Medtech companies to attend the conference. The financial support is **up-to 75% of eligible expenses**.

Arab Health brings together influencers from all major medical disciplines to facilitate the continuous advancements of healthcare in the region.

Which companies should apply for financial support?

- 1) Canadian companies from the medical device or medtech industries.
- 2) Conducted research into the medtech markets in the Middle East and North Africa
- 3) Companies that have not been to Arab Health.
- 4) Companies that are not receiving support from other funding sources (E.g., other government funding, basically, no double-dipping).

Why the MENA is important for Canadian medtech:

Prospects for the medtech sector have generally been very positive in the Middle East & North Africa (MENA) region over the past decade. The market is estimated at US\$9.3 billion in 2018, compared with US\$3.7 billion in 2006. This represents an annual average rise of 8.5% over the period. Expenditure per person, while low by Western standards, has doubled to US\$23.

The markets of the region are at very different stages of development. The most advanced health sectors are found in Israel and the oil/gas rich Gulf States of Kuwait and the United Arab Emirates. The north African states generally have a lower level of spending, but have also

experienced rapid rises in medtech investment, despite ongoing political instability. MedTech Markets projects that the MENA market will reach US\$12.2 billion by 2023, equal to US\$28 per capita.
